Common Questions:

What does the H before the course title mean?

- H stands for Honors
- Honors classes are more challenging
- Honors classes are 1 or 2 trimesters
- Honors classes are weighted 0.5 higher for your GPA.

For example, if you earn an A in an H class, you will have 4.5 factored in your GPA



Common Questions:

What does the AP before the course title mean?

AP stands for Advanced Placement, these are much more rigorous classes and last a full year.

College credit is dependent upon score from exam taken at the end of the course

AP classes are weighted 1.0 higher for your GPA.

GPA Requirement

. Students will have a cumulative GPA of 3.50 (weighted) through the end of winter trimester senior year.

Advanced Diploma

In order to earn an Advanced Diploma, students must meet **ALL** the requirements for an Honors Diploma above as well as complete a minimum of four (4) Advanced Placement (AP) classes.









Honor Cord

- Students must have a cumulative GPA of 3.80 (weighted) through the end of winter trimester senior year.
- Ten days after the final winter trimester grades are posted, honor cord students will be selected. Any grade changes
 after that will not be considered.
- Students must earn an Honors or Advanced Diploma.
- Students must complete all sections of two- or three- trimester-long academic courses (English, social sciences, science, mathematics, and world language). If a two- or three-trimester course is dropped, then a student is ineligible for the honor cord.
- Students will be enrolled in a minimum of 5 courses each trimester throughout the four years of high school unless
 otherwise arranged with their counselor (exceptions may be made for international exchange programs or early
 entrance to college).
- Students cannot have an P (pass), NP (no pass), or NG (no grade) on their transcript for any class that requires a letter grade.
- An NC is acceptable if students repeated a class to improve their grade.
- Students will meet the responsibilities for behavior as outlined in the Code of Conduct.
- 2 or more instances of academic dishonesty will terminate the opportunity to earn an honor cord.

Valedictorian and Salutatorian

The graduating senior student with the highest weighted cumulative grade point average through mid-term grades of spring trimester senior year will be the Valedictorian. When mid-term grades are posted, the Valedictorian and Salutatorian will be chosen. Any grade change after that will not be considered. The student with the next highest grade point average will be Salutatorian. In the event two or more students have the same grade point average, Co-Valedictorians or Co-Salutatorians will be named. Both the Valedictorian and Salutatorian must have earned an Honor Cord.

World Languages


- OCHS offer studies in French,

Recommended Spanish Course Sequence








Work Experience

- Available for students in 11th and 12th grades.
- Completion of a work agreement contract, with signatures by parent/guardian, student, and employer.
- Completion of a minimum of 150 hours of work experience
- Each 150 hours worked will result in 0.5 elective credits.
- Maximum of 2.0 total credits available.
- A work log, signed by the employer, verifying hours.
- As a Junior you can only take Work Experience outside of your school day.
