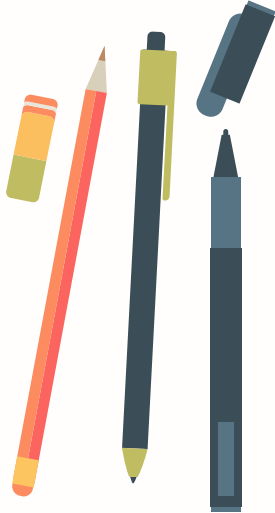




Honors & Advanced Diploma Requirements

Honors Diploma

Subject Area	ELIGIBLE COURSES
English 3.5 credits with at least three course sequences from:	Honors English 10, Honors American Literature, Honors English 12, AP Language and Composition, Honors Humanities, AP Literature & Composition
Mathematics 3.0 credits with sequence ending at:	AP Precalculus, Discrete Math, AP Statistics, AP Calculus A/B, or AP Calculus B/C
Science 3.0 credits with at least 1.0 credit from:	Honors Environmental Science, Honors Microbiology, Honors Comparative Anatomy and Physiology, Honors Geology, AP Biology, AP Chemistry, AP Physics
Social Sciences 3.0 credits with 1.5 from:	AP US History, AP US Government & Politics, AP Human Geography, or AP Psychology
World Language 3.0 credits/years of one language:	German, Spanish, or French
Fine Arts or Applied Arts .5 credits from:	Any Fine Arts or Applied Arts course



GPA Requirement

- Students will have a cumulative GPA of 3.50 (weighted) through the end of winter trimester senior year.

Advanced Diploma

In order to earn an Advanced Diploma, students must meet **ALL** the requirements for an Honors Diploma above as well as complete a minimum of four (4) Advanced Placement (AP) classes.





Honor Cord

- Students must have a cumulative **GPA of 3.80** (weighted) through the end of winter trimester senior year.
- Ten days after the final winter trimester grades are posted, honor cord students will be selected. Any grade changes after that will not be considered.
- Students must earn an Honors or Advanced Diploma.
- Students must complete all sections of two- or three- trimester-long academic courses (English, social sciences, science, mathematics, and world language). If a two- or three-trimester course is dropped, then a student is ineligible for the honor cord.
- Students will be enrolled in a minimum of 5 courses each trimester throughout the four years of high school unless otherwise arranged with their counselor (exceptions may be made for international exchange programs or early entrance to college).
- Students cannot have an P (pass), NP (no pass), or NG (no grade) on their transcript for any class that requires a letter grade.
- An NC is acceptable if students repeated a class to improve their grade.
- Students will meet the responsibilities for behavior as outlined in the Code of Conduct.
- 2 or more instances of academic dishonesty will terminate the opportunity to earn an honor cord.



Valedictorian and Salutatorian

The graduating senior student with the highest weighted cumulative grade point average through mid-term grades of spring trimester senior year will be the Valedictorian. When mid-term grades are posted, the Valedictorian and Salutatorian will be chosen. Any grade change after that will not be considered. The student with the next highest grade point average will be Salutatorian. In the event two or more students have the same grade point average, Co-Valedictorians or Co-Salutatorians will be named. Both the Valedictorian and Salutatorian must have earned an Honor Cord.

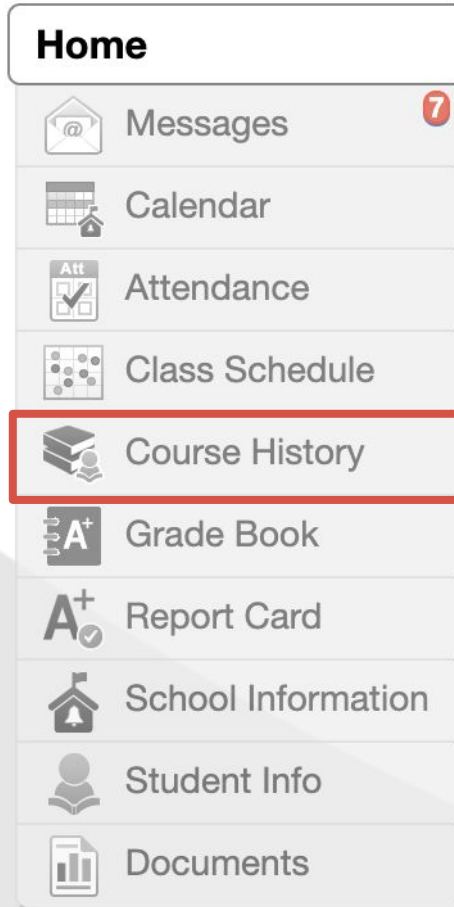

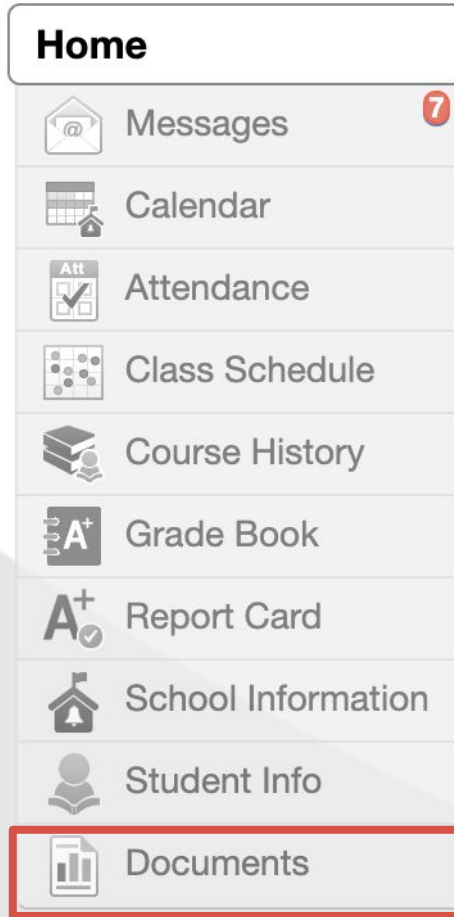

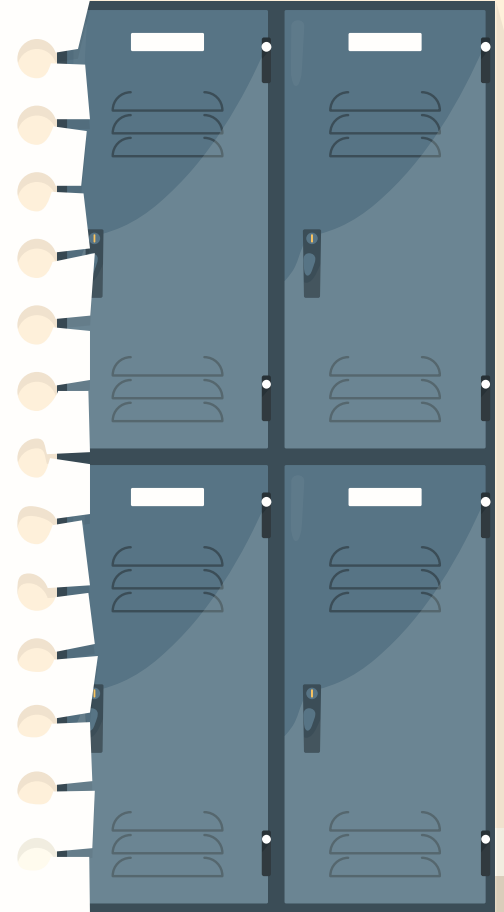


Work Experience

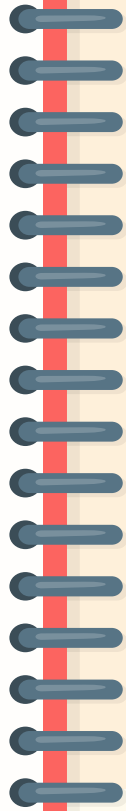

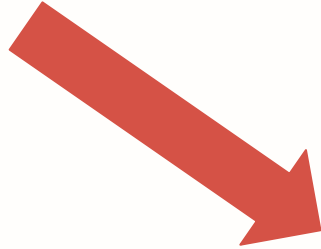

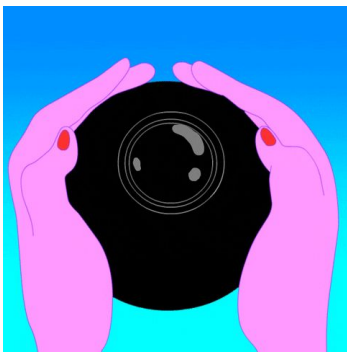
